Thirty years ago the Mt Barker Springs site, also known as Drovers' Rest, was thriving with native grasses, forbs and sedges. Recently the land has been heavily grazed, reducing native vegetation and enabling exotic plants to thrive and the soil to degrade. A significant regeneration project is now underway at the site, led by the fantastic team at Hills Biodiversity, which is focused on restoring the native grassland and enhancing the local biodiversity of Mt Barker Springs. This activity aligns with Codan's commitment to support initiatives that create a positive environmental impact on the wider community.
